<u>Reflections....Surprise After Surprise</u> (Anonymous)

Surprise builds on top of surprise. Just when the shepherds thought they had seen it all, behold, a whole host of angels appeared in the night sky over greater Bethlehem. This is how it is with God's love — one surprise after the other. If the shepherds reflected at all on their lives in those moments of sheer terror, they might have felt empty-handed. They had neither defense nor bribe for the divine forces assaulting their vision. They had little to show for their lives, little they could offer up to God. They didn't know that their empty hands were of no consequence to God — God loves us in spite of our poverty and poverty of spirit. When we take an honest appraisal of our lives, it becomes painfully clear that on a daily basis we fall far short of God's expectations. Yet, in spite of all that, God loves and forgives and makes us whole. That is the biggest surprise of all, and this is why this season is such a gift! It is a precious and holy time in which God allows us to

get our act together. Quickly now, before another surprise knocks us off our feet!
